LTC Daniel Sean Donahue, a United States Army Reserve (USAR) officer, has served as the Product Director for the Integrated Personnel and Pay System-Army (IPPS-A) Increment 1 since 2013. In this capacity, LTC Donahue supported the successful fielding of the Soldier Record Brief (SRB) to the Army National Guard (ARNG) and the Active Component in 2014, with the USAR to follow.

Prior to joining the IPPS-A team, LTC Donahue held numerous command positions in the 1-244th Aviation Battalion and the 812th Medical Air Ambulance Company. These positions include Company Commander of a UH-60 Blackhawk Company for two years and a UH-60 Aviation Maintenance Officer for six years. LTC Donahue was a first responder during the attacks on the World Trade Center on September 11, 2001, while working in New York City. During his time in the Louisiana Army National Guard, LTC Donahue was a founder of several small businesses.

LTC Donahue was called to Active Duty in 2004 and was assigned to the Utility Helicopter Project Office as the Assistant Product Manager (APM) for Light Utility Helicopter. LTC Donahue deployed to Iraq in 2004 and 2005 to oversee UH-60 Blackhawk fleet management and desert modification. He also deployed to New Orleans, La., during Hurricane Katrina in 2005. He later served as the APM, Air Traffic Navigation Integration Coordination System (ATNAVICS) & Fix Based Precision Approach Radar from 2006 to 2008. LTC Donahue deployed to Iraq again to oversee maintenance issues for the ATNAVICS fleet in 2007 and 2008. From 2008 to 2010, He served as the APM for the Universal Ground Control Station & Universal Ground Data Terminal. LTC Donahue was the APM for the Small Unmanned Aircraft Systems from 2010 to 2011 and deployed to Afghanistan to support Raven sustainment issues and the fielding of the Puma. Following this deployment, LTC Donahue was the APM for Apache Sensors and fielded Manned Un-Manned Teaming in the Apache for 1-101st attack battalion. Most recently, LTC Donahue led the Fixed Wing QRC program, deploying twice to Afghanistan, as well as leading the Fixed Wing foreign military sales from 2012 to 2013.

LTC Donahue was commissioned into the Aviation Branch of the United States Army in 1993. He earned a Master of Science degree in Management Logistics and a Masters Certificate in Business Management and Program Management from Florida Institute of Technology in Huntsville, Ala. He also holds a Bachelor's Degree in Accounting from George Mason University and Associates Degrees in Business Administration, General Studies and Education, from Northern Virginia Community College.
