

Army Training Environment with FIVE integrated and interoperable capabilities

Learning Content

Current Status

- 28 duplicative, stove-piped legacy systems
 - No shared standards across systems
 - Users required to enter duplicate data in separate systems
 - Multiple copies of authoritative data
 - Lack of common standards
 - Non-optimized user access

ATIS Capabilities Will Provide

- Soldiers & Civilians: A single sign-on system to take training and view their entire individual training record and identify self-development opportunities
- Unit Commanders: A current, accurate way to plan training and assess for unit training readiness
- Leaders: A dynamic training & common operational picture











ATIS Acquisition Approach

Modular contracting with task order on IDIQ for the solution integrator and a series of OTAs for capability development

Technical/Development Strategy

- Multiple COTS / GOTS
- Iterative Software Development, Scaled Agile Framework (SAFe)
- Army Cloud (cARMY) / CReATE
- Modular Open Systems Architecture anchored by a data mesh approach

Current Contract Strategy

- Modular contracting approach for competitive selection for multiple vendors to develop ATIS LOEs
- · Proposed contract efforts:
 - · Solution Integrator with IDIQ
 - LOE 1: ATMC/ATDC with OTA
 - LOE 2: TESC/TRMC with OTA
 - LOE 3: ALCMC with OTA
- Current funding constraints are impacting timeline for contract awards (Potential Awards FY24 or FY25)

Transition to Capability Support

- There is no "big bang" transition to capability support – Incremental parts of ATIS will transition to capability support as they are deployed
- FAR-based follow-on Capability Support (CS) Contract
- Plan to transition from initial deployment to continuous development
