

## Brigadier General Frederick (Fred) A. Hockett, Jr. United States Army Recruiting Command Deputy Commanding General - Support





Brigadier General (BG) Fred Hockett's military career started in 1987 as an Army Reserve Infantryman with the 70<sup>th</sup> Training Division. He later transitioned to active duty with the 4<sup>th</sup> Infantry Division at Ft. Carson, Colorado. After attending the United States Military Academy Prep School and the United States Military Academy at West Point, he commissioned as a Second Lieutenant of Infantry.

BG Hockett has served in various command and staff positions from the company to 3-star staff level. At the company level, he's commanded a Mechanized Infantry Company and Battalion Headquarters Company in the

Republic of Korea. His field grade officer staff assignments include US Army Reserve Command (USARC) G-33 Readiness Operations Branch Chief and Readiness Division Chief, Executive Officer for the USARC G-3/5/7, Director, Chief of Army Reserve's Action Group, and Director, G-33 (Operations, Readiness, and Mobilization) at the USARC Headquarters. He has multiple recruiting and retention assignments, including command of a Recruiting Company in the Great Lakes Recruiting Battalion, Recruiting Operations Officer at the University of Illinois – Chicago Army ROTC, and Battalion and Group Command in the Army Reserve Careers Group.

His current assignment is as the Deputy Commanding General – Support for the US Army Recruiting Command at Fort Knox, Kentucky.

His military awards and decorations are commensurate with his rank. He holds a Bachelor of Science degree from the US Military Academy at West Point and Master's Degrees from Central Michigan University and the United States Army War College.
